Dear Resident:

In November 2016, the Greenburgh Town Board passed a new pilot-local law that permits parking at the metered parking spaces on East Hartsdale Avenue and Columbia Avenue during the town-wide Snow Ordinance period (December 1 – March 15). Part of the new pilot-local law prohibits parking at the aforementioned parking spaces during a declared “**Snow Emergency**”. Please follow the link (<http://ecode360.com/search/GR0237?query=460&filter=newlaw>) to read the new pilot-local law. A Snow Emergency will be declared by 8:00pm on any given night and a “Snow Emergency Hotline” has been established for residents to check (914-989-1750).

On Sunday, December 11th, 2016 the Town of Greenburgh declared its first Snow Emergency. Notification was given via automated telephone calls to residents, email blasts, postings to the police department Facebook and Twitter accounts and an automated message was left on our snow emergency hotline. Additionally, electronic message boards were placed on East Hartsdale Avenue advising of the Snow Emergency.


Please ensure that you are signed up to receive notification of a declared Snow Emergency. The following are instructions to subscribe for such notifications:

- **E-Mail:** Send an e-mail to imailsrv@cit-e.net. Please include “subscribe”, “gblist” and “(your name)” in the body of the e-mail.
- **Automated Phone Message / Text Message:** Sign up for Code Red via the Town of Greenburgh website <http://www.greenburghny.com> and follow the link for the “Emergency Notification System”.

With snow in the forecast for this coming weekend, it is imperative that you check if a Snow Emergency has been declared.

Vehicles that obstruct snow clearing/removal operations are subject to being towed from the roadway. In addition to being fined for violating the law (\$250 first offense, \$500 each additional offense), towing and related fees may be in excess of \$200.
